The two-mile stretch of trophy trout water sits on a 1500 acre private preserve that's been unavailable to the public for well over fifty years. A pure genetic line of rainbow and brown trout has been passed down from the 1960s when the Georgia DNR ceased trout stockings on Noontootla Creek. Since then, this pure genetic line has been protected and passed down from generation to generation through natural reproduction in the stream.

This caliber of hopper fishing is not typical in the higher elevation trout streams of the Appalachian Mountains. The farming of corn and milo inside the Noontootla Creek Farm preserve, however, provides exceptional habitat and food for the land born terrestrials (Grasshoppers, Beetles, Ants) that end up in huge numbers floating down the stream and eventually in the stomachs of the resident trout. The trophy trout on the preserve gorge themselves on this available food source during the summer months, similar to the conditions which are normally found only on the west coast.

"This epic terrestrial fishing is really hard to come by on the East coast," said Capt. Kent Klewein, owner and head fly fishing guide of Reel Job Fishing. "Noontootla Creek offers fly fishermen some of the most exciting hopper fishing on the east coast for trophy trout, and we're really pleased to be able to offer our clients that experience."
