

## **Females have advanced sexual software superior to males basic version**

A new sexual health book claims men and women are born with incompatible 'sexual programs' and that women have the superior 'full option' software whilst men get by with the basic 'reproduction only' version. There is little doubt the No 1 cause of arguments and relationship breakdown, is sexual dissatisfaction. Since the No 1 cause of unsatisfactory sex is incompatibility between partners, gaining an understanding of the inherent sexual abilities of both sexes and lifting the standard of the weaker performer may well be a recipe for better relationships.
