

European Travelers Gear Up for Springtime Cultural Celebrations in Prague

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Prague, Czech Republic – April 27, 2007 – The staff at EuroBookings.com (eurobookings.com) say that tourism in Prague has increased dramatically over the last several years based on their observation of a growing percentage of interest in Prague hotels.
