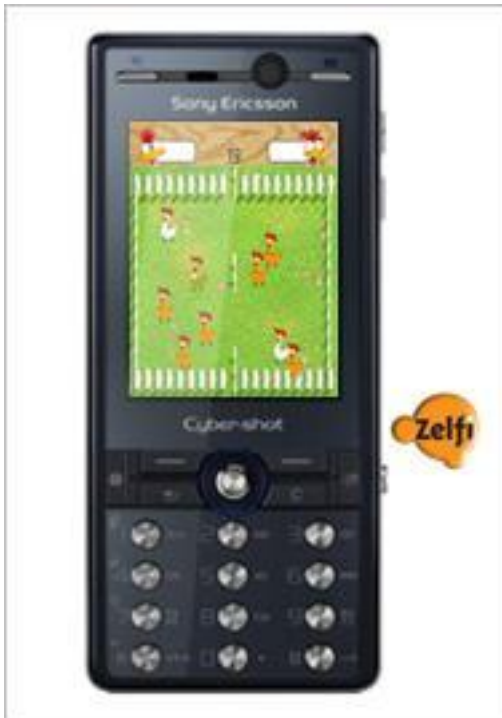


Rescue Chickens Before They Catch the H5N1 Virus in the Cell Phone Game ChickenLethal
